#### Teaching Philosophy

I have adopted a teaching philosophy, which stresses the development of a necessary set of forest resources knowledge and skills. This philosophy incorporates traditional lectures with classroom and field-based activities designed to engage students on several levels and to solidify important concepts. Realistic field exercises require students to synthesize information from a variety of sources, and to utilize critical thinking and problem solving skills to produce timely, appropriate, and technically sound solutions. Necessary background knowledge and field techniques are the emphasis, but must students also be able to share ideas and solutions and communicate effectively to a variety of audiences.

Incorporating an interactive teaching style can increase the level of student participation, give additional opportunities for assessing student performance, and allow students to improve their verbal communication skills. I feel that inquiry-based exercises provide a basis for learning how to learn not only from the instructor, but also from each other. The foundation that students build in college must also include cultivating their natural curiosity and developing an inquisitive approach to problems and new situations. These are the keys to life-long learning and continuing career development.
