

**Certificate in Modern Language and
Area Study** *CFR-French, CGE-German, CSP-Spanish*

Students who qualify for a Certificate in either French, German or Spanish must complete **two years of the same modern language** (12 credits) and **three area study courses** (9 credits): **one course from II/1 and one course from II/2**. Students may choose the **third course from either list II/1 or II/2**. Students must attain a minimum 2.50 gpa on a 4.0 scale in these courses and earn a grade of C or better in each course that is used to meet certificate requirements.
