Some Thoughts

The broad range of thinking styles on campus can be a difficulty in moving forward, but they can also allow diverse problem solving ideas: cognitive diversity. To make use of cognitive diversity:

- 1. The Senate needs to respond in a timely and responsible manner.
- 2. The Administration needs to seek input from the Senate early in the process of the development of new policies and procedures.
- 3. The Board of Control could take advantage of the diversity of ideas if they would allow the Senate to review proposed changes to their policies and make suggestions.
