Cash prizes will be awarded for the best entries, which will be judged on technical merit and relation to water resources. Winners will be announced at the World Water Day Lecture, 4:00 in the MUB Ballroom on March 25.

Posters must be a **PowerPoint slide** that can be added to a presentation for a panel of judges.

Preferred Poster Size: 48" x 27", horizontal will work best for digital presentation in Judging Sessions. We are recommending a font size of 30 points or more for the main text, and no smaller than 24 for figure captions and references. Bigger fonts are better! Also be aware that dark print on dark backgrounds is difficult to read.

Student GLRC Affiliation: By registering for this poster competition, students presenting Original Research posters will be added to the glrc-student-community-l@mtu.edu email list.

GLRC Logo: Please include the GLRC logo on your poster. From <http://www.mtu.edu/greatlakes/about/documents/>, Select "**Member Resources for Faculty & Staff,**" and select the logo that works best for your poster.

Multiple authors: Posters with multiple authors will be accepted, first author is contact person.

Previously presented posters: Posters presented at other conferences are welcome. Please indicate the name and date of the conference where it was previously presented on the registration form.

Poster Classification: Cash Awards will be offered in 2 categories (1st-\$300, 2nd-200, 3rd-\$150)

- 1) **Original Research Poster** (presentation of thesis or project research)
- 2) **Coursework/Informational Poster** (presentation of coursework or literature based research)
Extra points are awarded for Coursework/Information posters that incorporate the WWD theme of **Leaving No One Behind – Human Rights: Near & Far**

Judging Process: Posters and oral presentations are evaluated by a panel of 3 Michigan Tech faculty in individual conference rooms.

- 1) Each entry will receive a judging time; please advise of any schedule conflicts.
- 2) Posters will be displayed thru a PowerPoint presentation on a TV screen.
- 3) Students will individually present their posters to the judges:
 - a. 1 minute for judges to read and view poster;
 - b. **up to 5 minutes** for oral presentation;
 - c. **2 minutes** for questions and discussion.
 - d. The poster evaluation form is included on the last page of this file so students will know how posters will be evaluated
- 4) Printed posters are on display in the MUB Ballroom from 2:30 – 7:00. Plan to be present at your poster **2:30 – 4:00 pm** on March 25th for discussions with faculty and students.
- 5) Our Guest Lecturer, Monica Lewis-Patrick, will speak at 4:00 pm in the MUB Ballroom with a reception following.

If possible, take your posters down 6:30 – 7:00. If you can't be there, student volunteers will bring them to Dow 630
