### NOTES:

The Essential Education minor pathway is an option for any student. Following one of the Essential Ed minors may require some adjustments in the four year plan.

Additionally, English majors have many (up to 36) free electives that provide flexibility. Students are encouraged to take additional English coursework as free electives and/or consider adding a minor or coursework outside their major to explore other interests and enhance their degree. Minors that work particularly well with an English major include Media Production or Writing. Double majors or double degrees are also possible with the English major. Recent examples include English and Business, English and Computer Science, and English and Information Technology.
