association from 1892-1893. Written as a letter to his half-sister, Isabella Parnall Begle, it details his experience growing up in Rockland, Michigan, his attendance at the Michigan Mining School and subsequent career as a mine engineer and superintendent around the western United States and

Mexico.

Biography

Samuel Alexander Parnall was born in 1866 in Rockland, Michigan. He attended Michigan Mining School as part of its inaugural class, graduating in 1888 with a degree as a mine engineer. He was an engineer for the Cleveland Iron Mining Company and became the Chief Engineer for six years when the company expanded to become the Cleveland Cliffs Iron Mining Company. He was later an employed at Globe as the superintendent at the Old Dominion Copper Mine in Arizona and also worked at mines in Colorado and Mexico. Parnall was president of the Michigan Mining School Alumni Association from 1892-1893. The letter also describes the roles of Samuel's father, William Parnall and brother William Parnall, Jr. at National Mine, Franklin Mine, Phoenix Mines, Tamarack Mine, Cleveland Cliffs, Trimountain, and Calumet and Arizona.
