President Sweitz called meeting 669 to order at 5:30pm.

University CFO, Susan Kerry

"We are in a more stable place financially than last time presentation was made. Hard work paid off. Will be sharing some updates on finance, campus master planning, and employee benefits." How will work be prioritized? How will work be funded?

Question: Please comment on starting salaries of staff.

Response: Looking closely at the situation. Made some changes (i.e. signing bonuses) but dealing with challenges of getting people through the door. "We are falling short and it's a national phenomenon but we are looking for solutions."

Question: In terms of new building structures, how will the administration deal with current space needs for new faculty and more students, let alone new structures?

Response: Top priority is renovating current spaces, research and academic. Also taking into account "swing" spaces.

Question: Several years ago, a resolution to have starting salaries at \$15/hour passed, when will MTU implement this?

Response: There is progress looming but cannot give details yet. Working on this and will update later.

Question: Working from home? Is it more welcome since Covid?

Response: Looking at the positions that do not have a front-facing component for students, more appropriate for working from home. Considering space utilization as well. Looking at all components of the issue. Students often want to deal with people directly so it is a continuous process of negotiation.

Question: Tracking numbers of TT and non-TT, are we where we should be in terms of salary?

Response: Looking at competitive situations and working with the Provost on this.

Question: University's commitment to childcare going forward?

Response: Set a timeframe to get something done. Committed to addressing it. It is a benefit that affects a subset of employees so how to evaluate this against investment needs? Thinking through solutions (i.e. rent space? Build space?) Still waiting on report.

President's Report:

President Sweitz begins with thanking Vice President Knustrup for job well done during absence.

Reiterate the "great job" done by the Senate on Proposal 2-22. Board was very appreciative or work and compromise. 19-22 is critical to this discussion. Agreement made that these procedures will take place in Fall 2022.

Still looking for volunteers for an ad hoc committee for structured meeting times.

Proposal 25-22 to create another ad hoc for updating the constitution and bylaws. Seeking volunteers for this committee as well.

Committee Reports:

AIPC – Tim Scarlett - Plan for 19-22 will begin circulating "nuggets of information about the student evaluation process as committee goes through" and others can share with their constituents. That way when the bill is ready there will be a prepared ground for discussion.

APC - Rick Berkey - Collaboration on 19-22 covered by Tim Scarlett.

15-22, sabbatical leave application timing, will strike a balance on the subject. 16-22, Presidential Search, will bring back from being tabled and bring better language, which will affect other search procedures. May treat Chair search differently but the others will come in an efficient manner. Senate self-evaluation instrument will have result and will be presented next meeting. Similarly, the President's evaluation survey will also be presented. Open to suggestions for survey questions. Need to finalize that instrument.
