AMENDMENT TO THE BY-LAWS: REDEFINITION OF A QUORUM AND SENATE MEMBERSHIP

Background: Article I, paragraph A1 of the University Senate By-Laws defines a quorum as two-thirds of the full Senate membership. Periodically, there have been insufficient Senators in attendance to meet this quorum. In part, the lack of a quorum occurs because several representation units have not identified their Senators and Alternates while other units' Senators or Alternates do not regularly attend University Senate meetings.

Proposal: To make it more likely that there will be quorums at University Senate meetings, the University Senate proposes the following change to the By-Laws.

I OPERATIONAL BYLAWS

A. Quorum

- 1. One-half of all elected Senators or elected Alternates shall constitute a quorum to transact Senate business requiring action of all Senators. One-half of all elected faculty Senators or Alternates shall constitute a quorum to transact Senate business requiring action of faculty Senators only. One-half of all elected professional staff Senators or Alternates shall constitute a quorum to transact Senate business requiring action of professional staff Senators only.
- 2. Elected Senators and Alternates are those persons who have been elected by their constituent academic or professional staff units.
