- 3. <u>General Description:</u>
 - a. The Theatre Division of the Visual and Performing Arts Department (within the College of Sciences and Arts) proposes a new minor called Theatre Performance. The minor is intended to serve students interested in specific curriculum and experiences in acting. The minor would complement both the Theatre Technology minor, which (as the title suggests) focuses more specifically on technology in the theatre and entertainment industries, and the more general Theatre Arts minor which provides a much broader curriculum. The Theatre Performance minor is designed to provide foundational skills in acting and allows students to choose introductory courses geared toward skills in voice and movement. The minor requires experiential/practical courses that allow students to practice the skills learned through coursework. A choice of advanced classes provides further exploration of specific acting genres. The Theatre Performance minor will be available to any undergraduate student with an interest in acting (except those already enrolled in the Theatre and Electronic Media Performance major).
 - b. The proposed program leverages existing faculty and resources in theatre and music.
- 4. Learning Objectives:

Upon successful completion of this minor, students will be able to:

- Identify the factors that define the role of the actor as a creative collaborator in the context of the theatre and media industries.
- Employ a variety of acting techniques appropriate to diverse theatrical styles and genres
- Create dynamic characters through complex script analysis.
- *Perform with confidence*. <u>Rationale</u>:

Participation in Visual and Performing Arts ensembles, and the opportunity to study performing arts minors, has provided many Michigan Tech students an outlet for creativity, enrichment, and scholarship. Many other schools do not offer a performance minor (*see Related Programs*) due to insufficient acting opportunities for non-majors, as preference is given to majors in production casting.

At Michigan Tech, non-majors regularly have performance opportunities, and adding this minor would encourage more of those students to take a few additional credits to complete the more rounded experience of a minor. Prospective students have often enquired about a performance minor during campus visits--offering this minor may be a recruitment advantage with students for whom this type of experience is desirable.

Michigan Tech would be the only university in the Michigan system to offer the option of a minor specializing in Theatre Performance that incorporates theatre and multimedia performance styles and genres.

5. <u>Related Programs</u>:

Benchmark Institutions -

Half of our benchmark institutions offer a minor similar to our current Theatre Arts Minor. (Carnegie Mellon University, Lehigh University, the University of Missouri – Rolla, California Polytechnic State University – San Luis Obispo.) These minors are traditional, providing a largely rounded curriculum in theory with some opportunities to take a couple of specialized courses in performance or technology. Three institutions offer no theatre degrees. Rensselaer Polytechnic University offers a unique minor in Video, Performance, and Social Practice that combines theory and practice in movie making.

Michigan Public Universities

Half of the Michigan public universities offer a broad minor in Theatre, similar to our Theatre Arts minor. The University of Michigan and Wayne State University offer the largest and most comprehensive theatre programs in the state with highly specialized minors in areas such as Global Theatre and Ethnic Studies, Performing Arts Management, Africana Theatre and Dance, etc. Eastern Michigan University offers the most comprehensive array of minors: Three Musical Theatre minors specifically for majors (Dance, Theatre, Music) used as an optional extension for specialization; Arts and Entertainment Management; Communication Media and Theatre Arts Comprehensive; Drama/Theatre for the Young; Electronic Media and Film Studies; Entertainment Design and Technology; Theatre Arts.

6. Curriculum Design

Title of Minor: Minor in Theatre Performance

Catalog Description: Acting is not just for the entertainment industry. Today's actors are hired to perform in all manner of advertising and media platforms, as well as in media-based activities such as video gaming, audiobooks, training videos, website tutorials, etc. Students will learn to produce their own audio and video with industry-standard software, hardware, and facilities.
