Proposal for shelving Bachelor of Arts in History

- 1. Full name of program to be shelved: Bachelor of Arts in History
- 2. Final term program will be open for new admits: Fall 2025
- 3. Plan to complete all enrolled students and any returning students:
 - a. Currently there are 4 students enrolled and they are all expected to graduate in the next 2 years. Current students will be allowed to complete the BA in History.
- 4. Reason for shelving or unshelving:
 - a. We are proposing shifting this program into a concentration within the Social Sciences BS degree program in order to allow more students to double major (due to the requirement that double majors be the same degree type), to increase interest in the program, and to emphasize the methodological focus of historical studies within a social sciences department.
- 5. Financial impact (if any) to the department and university:
 - a. There will be no financial impact on the university, as we already have a history advisor and history faculty in place.
