The University Senate of Michigan Technological University Proposal 17-25 (Voting Units: Academic)

Proposal to Amend Senate Policy 711.1: Policy on Graduate Faculty Status Presented by: Academic and Instructional Policy Committee

Revisions to the University policy on Senate policy 711.1, Graduate Faculty Status, are sought.

Background and Rationale

This proposal from the Graduate School is to modify section 1.5.3 of the Faculty Handbook. The current policy on graduate faculty status uses language that the university no longer employs (*e.g.* nontenure track faculty vs. instructional track faculty). This revision also expands who may have full graduate faculty status, in recognition of the increasing role that research faculty staff play in graduate education.

The new policy, as amended, is below. The track changes version is also included at the end of this document.

Senate Policy 711.1

A. Membership

The Graduate Faculty consists of members of the academic faculty holding the rank of ASSISTANT PROFESSOR, ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR, or PROFESSOR (either instructional or tenure track (T/TT)) who have been appointed by the Dean of the Graduate School. Faculty who are awarded EMERITUS status upon retirement remain members of the Graduate Faculty.

The Dean of the Graduate School may also grant Graduate Faculty Status to other people with an ongoing professional relationship with Michigan Tech. Under special circumstances, the Graduate Dean may appoint qualified individuals with special technical expertise to Graduate Faculty Status for a specific term and purpose, such as serving as a member of a student's advisory committee.

B. Types of Appointments

There are two types of appointments to Graduate Faculty Status:

Full Appointment: Members with full appointment to Graduate Faculty Status are eligible to teach graduate courses (5000 level and above), serve as members on Master's and PhD committees, and supervise Master's and PhD students as sole or co-advisor. Tenure track faculty are appointed with full status.

Associate Appointment: Persons with special technical expertise may be appointed to associate Graduate Faculty Status to serve as member of a student's advisory committee and/or to serve as a coadvisor for a graduate student and/or to teach 5000 and 6000 level courses.

Those with an associate appointment to Graduate Faculty Status are ineligible to serve as a graduate student's sole advisor. Associate appointments are for a specific term and purpose. Eligibility and roles for the two types of Graduate Faculty Status appointments are summarized in Tables 1 and 2.

C. Qualifications of those with Graduate Faculty Status.

It is expected that all appointed to Graduate Faculty Status possess:

• a record of research, scholarship, or achievement appropriate for the graduate program that nominates them:

c. The candidate is considered an expert in the course(s) taught or the scholarly activity supervised.

- the necessary background for, and a continued interest in, teaching graduate courses; and
- a commitment to effectively advise, mentor, and fund graduate students.

Evidence that a candidate meets the qualification requirements may include, but is not limited to, that:

- They regularly publish articles in recognized journals having national distribution, author books/chapters related to their field of study, or are otherwise recognized for their research and scholarship.
- They have earned the terminal degree in their field.
- They have a record of effectively advising, mentoring, and/or funding graduate students.

Senate Policy 711.1

A. Membership

The Graduate Faculty consists of members of the academic faculty holding the rank of ASSISTANT PROFESSOR, ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR, or PROFESSOR (either instructional or tenure track (T/TT)) who have been appointed by the Dean of the Graduate School. Tenured and tenure track Faculty who are awarded EMERITUS status upon retirement remain members of the Graduate Faculty.

The Dean of the Graduate School may also grant Graduate Faculty Status to other <u>peopleacademic</u> faculty with an on-going professional relationship with Michigan Tech-including RESEARCH faculty, <u>LECTURERS</u>, <u>INSTRUCTORS</u>, <u>PROFESSORS OF PRACTICE</u>, and <u>ADJUNCT faculty</u>. Under special circumstances, the Graduate Dean may appoint qualified individuals with special technical expertise to Graduate Faculty Status for a specific term and purpose, such as serving as a member of a student's advisory committee.

B. Types of Appointments

There are two types of appointments to Graduate Faculty Status:

Full Appointment: Members with full appointment to Graduate Faculty Status are eligible to teach graduate courses (5000 level and above), serve as members on Master's and PhD committees, and supervise Master's and PhD students as sole or co-advisor. <u>Tenure track faculty are appointed with full status.</u>

Associate Appointment: Persons with special technical expertise may be appointed to associate Graduate Faculty Status to serve as member of a student's advisory committee and/or to serve as a coadvisor for a graduate student and/or to teach 5000 and 6000 level courses.

Those with an associate appointment to Graduate Faculty Status are ineligible to serve as a graduate student's sole advisor. Associate appointments are for a specific term and purpose. Eligibility and roles for the two types of Graduate Faculty Status appointments are summarized in Tables 1 and 2.
