## Questions and comments included:

- How many tons of trash does Michigan Tech produce (1,000 tons and only 15% is diverted from the landfill)
- How come solar panels can't be placed on roofs? (snow)
  - Solar panels can be placed on sides of buildings
- Walmart plastic bags cannot be placed in recycle bins
- Check-out numbers on plastic (1-6 are recyclable)
- What does Goodwill do with shredding? (they work with a company called Compuserve)
- If you put wrong stuff in recycle container it will contaminate the whole container and the items will be put in landfill instead of recycled
- As a society we need to think more about what we throwaway and what doesn't have to be
- Are we considering wind on campus or Alberta? (We are not in a good location for wind – solar is better)
