Visitor Parking

Permits are available to purchase online https://mtuparking.t2hosted.com or at the Transportation Services Office.

Daytime Parking (7:00 AM to 4:00 PM):

Meters and Visitor Lots can be utilized with a Visitor Permit or via **ParkMobile**. Download the **ParkMobile App** or call 1-800-280-4146 (if you are already a registered ParkMobile user).

Nighttime Parking (2:00 AM to 7:00 AM):

May 1 - October 31 - Parking is permitted on campus without a permit from 4:00 PM to 7:00 AM with the exception of Lots 4, 7E/W, 10E, 15E/W, 16, 17, 21 and 23.

<u>November 1 - April 30</u> - Parking is permitted in designated areas with a Visitor Permit. Contact our office during normal office hours or the Department of Public Safety and Police Services after hours (906-487-2216) with any questions about designated visitor parking locations.
