Subject: Trailer Parking Permits - Next Year
Body: Dear Trailer Permit Holder,

This email is to inform you that trailer permits expire at the end of the day today. If you plan to keep your trailer on campus over the summer, you will need to purchase a summer trailer permit. Please contact Transportation Services if you are interested in obtaining one .

Looking ahead to fall, Transportation Services will be implementing changes to trailer parking in the Upper Daniell Heights lot due to an increase in violations and parking issues this past winter. Beginning with the Fall 2026 semester, students bringing trailers to campus should be aware of the following:

- All trailers must be registered with a state-issued license plate. Even if your state does not require one, Transportation Services will require a license plate attached to the trailer for identification purposes .
- Trailer parking should be considered long-term, cold storage parking. During the winter months, the trailer parking area will not be plowed regularly. If you remove your trailer and return to find no available space or the area inaccessible due to snow, you will be responsible for making alternative arrangements. Transportation Services will not provide priority snow removal for this lot. If you are simply looking for a place to store your trailer over the winter, purchasing a permit is recommended. However, if you anticipate needing regular or frequent access to your trailer, you should consider making alternative arrangements.
- Like all vehicles on campus, trailers must be registered and permitted within 48 hours of arrival. Any trailer that is not registered with Transportation Services within that timeframe will be subject to citation and impoundment.

Please review these changes carefully. If they do not meet your needs next year, you may want to explore other trailer parking options for the upcoming fall semester.
